Community Project Funding – Federal Appropriations Process	Fire Station	\$3 million	<p>Project was submitted to Congressman McNerney on April 19 and selected as one of the Congressman’s top projects to be submitted to the House Appropriations Committee for consideration. The project was included for \$1,500,000 in the Six-Bill Appropriations Minibus that passed the House on July 31.</p> <p>The project was also submitted to Senator Feinstein and Senator Padilla for consideration through the Senate Appropriations process. Senator Padilla selected the project as one of his finalists to be submitted to the Senate Appropriations Committee for consideration. The Senate is expected to begin marking up appropriations bills in August and September.</p>

The Foundation focuses its resources in areas served by Firehouse Subs restaurants (within a 60-mile radius).
